


Tree of Hope

Expenditure



Depending on a families circumstances, the money they raise isn't always used straight away and may be part of a bigger, long term fundraising aim over a number of years. The money we hold for a child can be held up until their 25th birthday, meaning our expenditure is often more or less that what has been raised overall in a year.

Our Impact

In the last year, the following was spent helping over 700 children and their families to access therapies, treatments and equipment, not obtainable via the NHS, to improve their quality of life in a host of different and impactful ways. In a year that the pandemic has continued to impact on fundraising practices, we're so roud of the resilience we have continued to show.

£263,690

bought over 200 pieces of specialist equipment

incurred when a child is in hospital or having specialist treatment not near home, causing the family less financial pressure

Case Study - Give George Freedom



George has a rare chromosome disorder and is the only person in the world that has his particular chromosome make up. He has seizures, is severely impaired and is defficient in growth hormones so requires a high level of specialist care.

The family's support network broke down completely during the pandemic and they are still working to get much of this support back, which has really highlighted to the family the need of support.

The family are aiming to raise £100,000 to fund home adaptations for George to access his home and for it be adapted for him. Giving George independence in his home is also something the family really want to achieve for George. They are only able to claim a limited proportion of funding from their local council, so they enlisted the support of Tree of Hope to help them to fundraise.

"The enthusiasm [from Tree of Hope] has been a big thing and not just saying what you could do, but actively making this happen for us. Things like PR for example, we were in all the local papers and all of a sudden people were wanting to help ...it gave us a real boost, just knowing others were behind us and supporting the campaign."
