


Tree of Hope Impact Report 2018-2019

Depending on a families circumstances, the money they raise isn't always used straight away and may be part of a bigger, long term fundraising aim over a number of years. The money we hold for a child can be held up until their 25th birthday, meaning our expenditure is often more or less that what has been raised overall in a year.

Our Impact

In the last year, the following was spent helping over 600 children and their families to access therapies, treatments and equipment which are not available through the UK healthcare system.

£226,261

bought over 200 pieces of specialist equipment

including specialist wheelchairs, hydrotherapy pools, adapted trikes, speclialist beds and specialist play

apparatus.





£126,865

covered families living expenses

when their child was in hospital having specialist treatment, meaning less financial pressure and a parent could stay with their child in hospital.

£762,684

was spent on specialist therapies

for children with physical disabilities who need extra mobility support and therapies associated with

Autism.







£117,561

has paid for SDR surgeries

for 5 children with Cerebral Palsy to reduce spasticity, increase their independence and give them the chance to be able to walk pain free.

£129,865

was used to support home adaptations

widening doorways, adding ramps for wheelchair access, specialist bathrooms, sensory gardens and adaptations to give a child comfort and accessability at home.





Case Study - Louis Loves Life



Louis is 9 years old and has Quadraplegic Cerebral Palsy, affecting all four limbs. Louis and his family came to Tree of Hope in need of fundraising support to assist with Louis' needs, including vital equipment, therapies as well a house adaptation, all of which are unavailable from the UK healthcare system.

Since their fundraising campaign, Louis' capabilities are going from strength to strength and he now has a home where he can live and develop in freely and comfortably.

Through their fundraising with Tree of Hope, the family received matchfunding, gift aid and had registered charity status which helped them gain community support including from local businesses, as well as complete financial management of their funds.

"Having Tree of Hope's support has has taken away a lot of the pressure and has helped us access more avenues of fundraising.
