On Saturday 20th August, Tree of Hope were there to be a part of and witness this fantastic inclusive event and support our families taking part at the beautiful Dorney Lake in Windsor, one of the sites of the London 2012 Olympics. Read on to find out about their epic challenges!

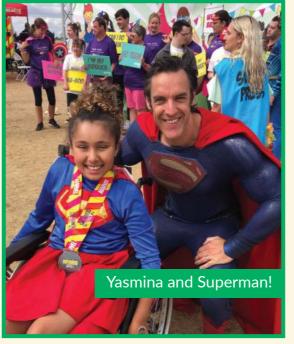
For the first time in three years, on Saturday 20th August, the Superhero Tri returned in full force after a break due to the pandemic, and there was a brilliant sense of excitement in the air!

Our superheroes joining us for the day were Zee & Yasmina and their families of sidekicks who were there to take on their parts of the triathlon course for their fundraising challenges to raise money for their Tree of Hope campaigns!

Congratulations to Ralph Marsh who also took part but completed the At Home version! Ralph smashed his challenge in support of his campaign!

As a Charity Partner of the event, Tree of Hope families can take advantage of our free spaces to use as a fundraiser and raise awareness of their campaigns in a fun and competitive way. This event is the only disability event of its kind in Europe, empowering young people and





children of all capabilities to complete all or part of the triathlon races harnessing their superhero powers!

Zee took to the cycle track first after his swimming partner completed the swim on Zee's behalf. Joining Zee were Mum Ellie and Grandad David who were his trusty sidekicks! After the warmup for Zee's wave, Zee completed 10K in his Trix Trike by Quest 88, who were there on the day to provide support with apparatus. He then completed 2.5km on a Rad Frame Runner to complete the triathlon, also from Quest 88. Ellie told us,

"Zee has never ever managed distances like he did at the event and the trike he used was amazing! It's definitely on our list of things to fundraise for!"

Ellie went on to say: "We had a wonderful day at Dorney Lake for this years Superhero series event. Huge thanks to Tree of Hope for the opportunity to take part, meet some amazing people, have so much fun and help us gain extra fundraising for Zee's campaign."

Yasmina, our second superhero of the day completed her challenge with sidekicks Mum Touria, Dad, Hassan and sister Anissa. Yasmina explained: "The superheroes Triathlon was a very memorable and unforgettable day! To complete the triathlon, I used a race runner and I proudly completed the 20km track which shocked my disability." She went on to say "I still can't believe I did it, to this very day!"

Yasmina's Mum Touria told us, "Now and always, I will say that the distance that my daughter completed...shocked all of us... It was not an easy challenge; my daughter Yasmina has proved to herself and everyone that her ability is stronger than her Disability, and her mental wellbeing has the strength to support her physically."

Since the event, Yasmina has competed in the National Championships for horse riding. It is Yasmina's dream to compete in the Paralympics Team GB in the Para Equestrian

entries. We love Yasmina's ambition to succeed in what she loves doing best and continues to champion her abilities in every way, as our families constantly prove.

We were all joined by the amazing 'Our Superhero Life', Wonder Woman & Superman who joined

Superman who joined us for the day to encourage our families and be a part of team Tree of Hope! Laura, who is Co Founder of Rock Solid a Health and Wellness Business, with her husband Barry, explained, "We have met some

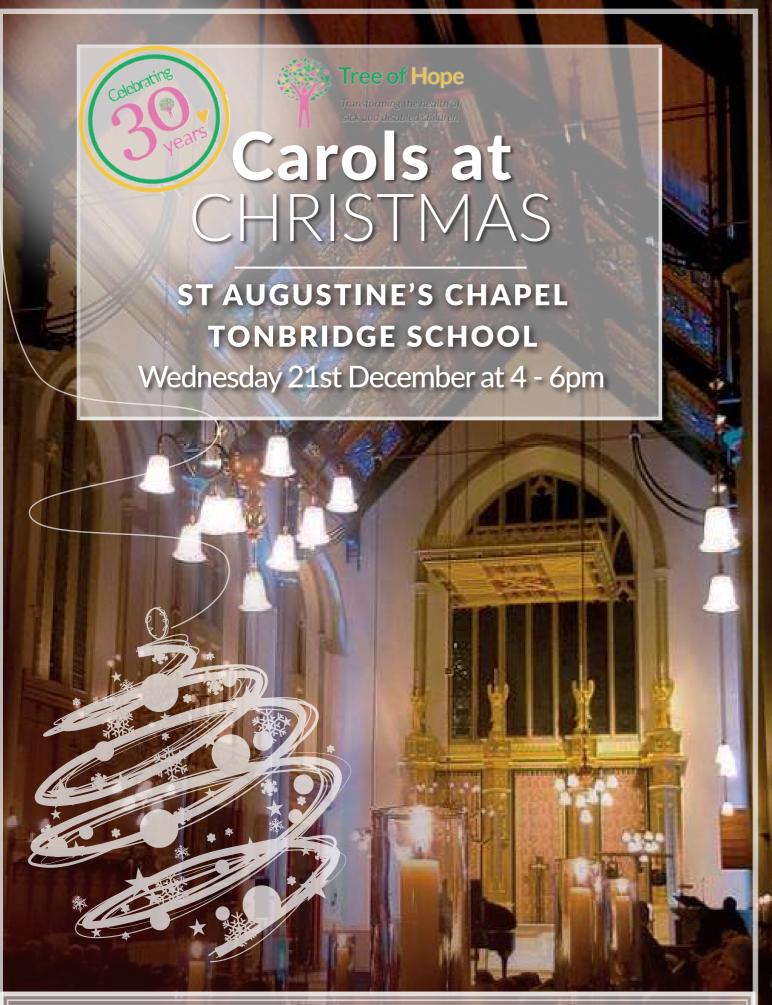

Working Families

For families with young children, the conversation about returning to work or staying at home to care for the children can often be a difficult discussion, and arguably even more challenging for parents with a sick or disabled child, due to the complications of attending hospital appointments, or being responsible for managing their daily medical needs. We recently spoke to 'Working Families' about the helpful service that they run. Read on to find out more about your working rights as a parent.



Working Families is a UK-wide charity which provides free legal advice to parents and carers about their rights at work. Aiming to remove the barriers that people with caring responsibilities can face in the workplace, Working Families gives employers the tools they need to support their caregiving employees, whilst advocating for the rights of the UK's 13 million working parents.

Mary Brown from Working families told us that their key areas of focus range from "offering free legal advice about vour rights at work, childcare, benefits. maternity leave and pay, discrimination, flexible working and much, much more." The organisation works with employers "through a membership scheme to support them to become more flexible and family friendly", which has become much more of a necessity of employment over recent years.

The most significant reason as to why flexibility within the workplace is requested more often is largely because "people are worried about how they will cope with the rising cost of living, as people in full time work are struggling to pay the bills". The cost of childcare can be unobtainable, particularly in combination with the rising costs of food and fuel, so Working Families "get a lot of queries about flexible working and if you're entitled to it."

Mary explained that the team at Working Families often speak to parents who "know that they have certain rights at work, but might not have the confidence to ask their employer to exercise their rights. That is why our

team is on hand, who can help to roleplay certain scenarios so that parents get to practice how they ask, which can give them the confidence they need to approach their employers."

We asked Mary how parents can get in touch for free legal advice and support, and she told us that their website is a good place to start, as it offers information about employer and employee rights, "but for more urgent or specific queries, it would be best to call our helpline, which is open from 11am until 2pm. The phones are answered by trained people who can refer you to the correct department".

Mary went on to say "We also have an online form which people can fill in. It is a detailed form with lots of questions, but that is to ensure that we can give personalised advice to suit the parent's specific queries".

The working families team offered some advice to Tree of Hope families about their rights at work

Whilst an employer has the right to refuse flexible working, an employee has the right to request it.

If you have worked for your employer for over a year, you are entitled to 4 weeks per year, per child of parental leave. Parental leave can be taken in blocks of 1 week at a time, or if your child is on DLA or PIP, you can take it in blocks of 1 day.

You have the right to take emergency time off for dependants. This time off is limited to use in unforeseen situations, for example if your child is taken ill and you have to pick them up from school at short notice.

In some circumstances you may be able to take special leave, such as compassionate leave, if your employer offers this. This type of leave may be

The joy of watching your child grow into a happy and fun-loving child is one of life's greatest pleasures, and as we all know, each child's journey in life is completely unique and full of many twists and turns! Alexander is a happy, funny and loving little boy who just so happens to need an extra helping hand to help him thrive and develop, due to his diagnosis of Global Development Delay and Epilepsy. Parents Zee and Fong have shown sheer determination in helping Alexander by fundraising for intensive therapies which will help him to develop and thrive alongside his peers! Read on to find out more.

Alexander Jamie (AJ) was born in April 2019 and lives with his mum, Zee and dad, Fong! His parents describe him as a "happy, fun, loving little boy" who loves reading books, being sung nursery rhymes, and being with his peers at nursery. Alexander is somewhat of a little celebrity at Nursery as mum. Zee told us that "he's got a bit of a fan club with the girls at nursery. He loves going on the see saw and his friends always want to join in with him when they see him on it. Whilst he loves watching his peers at Nursery, they also try to include him as much as they can, and he does really enjoy it there".

For Alexander, taking part in nursery games, exercises and activities is that little bit harder, due to his diagnosis of Global Development Delay and Epilepsy. Zee explained that with his Global Development Delay, "he's behind in all of his milestones.

He's non-verbal, he can't crawl or pull himself up and can often fall backwards when he's sitting." His other diagnosis of Epilepsy can cause further complications as he "has head drop seizures and atonic seizures, meaning his head falls all of a sudden and can last for 1-2 seconds at a time. though he is provided with a soft helmet to protect his head".

The worry that his parents have is that "as he gets older and heavier, if we take him somewhere like soft play or even nursery, an adult needs to be on hand to help him to play; so to include him in play time, we have to help him". Zee told us that it's getting clearer that "as Alexander gets older, he's falling more and more behind his peers, so we have started fundraising for various therapies which we hope will close the gap a bit and help him as much as possible".

Zee went on to say "we've been doing our research on other organisations and charities and had explored the idea of private therapies, which is how we found out about Swim Lab, but of course, all therapies come at a cost. We are living on a one-person salary as



Alex's father Fong has put his career on hold to be his full-time carer juggling Alex's busy schedule", so this is when the family decided to approach Tree of Hope to give fundraising a go.

Zee's initial target was to fundraise for a week of intensive therapy at the Swim Lab International Therapy with Trexo Plus. The Swim Lab is based in Lanzarote and provides fun and ambitious aquatic sessions which are expertly tailored to each child. The addition of a wearable Trexo Plus device helps to control lower limb movements and improves gait training through the use of incredible technology. Alexander's parents hope that the "intensive therapy sessions will



help him to become more independent and hopefully help him to take his first steps".

After just a few short days of

fundraising, Zee was stunned to see that their initial target of £1.900 had been

exceeded and told us that "we've been overwhelmed and blown away at how generous people have been", which gave the family the confidence they needed to raise

their fundraising target figure to £20.000 to cover an additional Swim Lab week in 2024 and multiple therapies for Alexander as he grows.

Explaining to us their main source of fundraising, Zee said that "a lot of the funds that we have raised so far has

been down to friends and family. We have shared our campaign on social media and so a lot has been raised by our support group".

Alongside donating money, Zee's friend Jennie Cun who "has got a beauty salon called JSpa, has put together a raffle. Some of the prizes, donated by a variety of local businesses, include a salon treatment of choice, Yoga sessions, a free haircut and

> a bottle of Rose, plus many more. The raffle was drawn at the beginning of October and raised £329 which has been from her clients mainly", helping the family to not only raise awareness of their campaign, but of Global Development Delay (GDD) too, as "a lot of people in our community don't really know much about GDD so it's good to help raise awareness" of the condition.

Zee explained that "a big part of our campaign which we believe is important for us and Alexander is making people aware that not all disabilities are visible - some are not immediately obvious".

To help momentum going with their fundraising, Zee organised a fundraising Breakfast at her work with William Pears Group in West Hampsted on 28th September. Zee told us that "We had bucks fizz, bacon rolls, pastries

> and granola pots on offer on the menu, and invited our office, as well as other offices we work with. People are usually so busy that they don't normally have time to meet for events like this"

Explaining the benefits of being with Tree of Hope, Zee said that "we've hugely benefited from being able

to match the donations that we've made for the breakfast", which is one of the many perks of fundraising with a registered charity. From the get-go



Alexander's parents have found that "the communication and process with Tree of Hope has been really easy and everyone's been on board with us and supportive too".

We asked Zee and Fong what advice they would give to other families facing a similar situation and they urged people to just go for it as "there will be so many people that want to support you. There have been people that we know of and haven't spoken to in so long, who have just wanted to help – it really brings people together and makes people aware." Zee went on to say that she "was hesitant about sending out the breakfast invitation email at work, but I had one colleague, Richard Chan, who was really supportive and told me to just go for

Their fundraising has so far exceeded the family's expectations for the amount of money that they could raise, and so we'd love to wish Zee, Fong and Alexander all the very best in achieving their £20,000 target. The sky is the limit!

We will be hosting more Golf Days in 2023, so watch this space for more information!





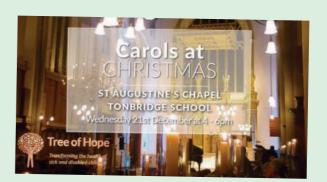

Rooting For Rudy!

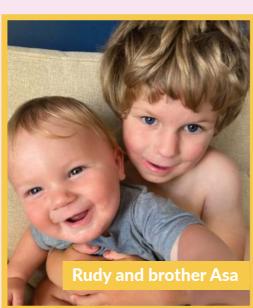
Facing some very challenging circumstances, the strength and determination shown by families is a constant source of inspiration to us. Getting to grips with the usual chaos of parenthood, as well as facing the news of a recent diagnosis and the need to raise vital funds for their child's medical needs can be a daunting prospect, but for Rudy and his family, they have taken it all in their stride. Rudy's family have recently started their journey with Tree of Hope to help fund life-changing SDR surgery, to secure more independence for their happy and characterful little boy! Read on to find out more!

At first glance Rudy Bingham is your average three year old - bouncy, happy and very loud, who loves his dinosaurs and cars! It's not until you see him walk that you will notice anything different about him.

Mum Fiona is an adult physiotherapist and had a suspicion something wasn't quite right even though Rudy was meeting all the usual milestones. Despite this it still came as something of a shock to receive a late diagnosis of Cerebral Palsy when Rudy was two years old.

Although just affecting his legs, the Cerebral Palsy has a considerable affect on Rudy's everyday life,

meaning he experiences issues with his balance, can't stand still for very long, often crawls and can't keep up with his friends and family. He also experiences tightness in his calves which is very painful for him and makes him cry during the night. His younger brother Asa who is just 11 months old will soon be overtaking him in terms of physical ability which is hard for the family to watch. The family also live opposite a school and it is becoming apparent that Rudy is starting to comprehend there is something different about him as he sees the other children on the move.







Rudy has a huge amount of determination and doesn't let anything stop him. The family are delighted that

he has been accepted for SDR surgery at Bristol in the next year or so, and so the family are currently fundraising to provide him with the intensive physiotherapy he needs after the operation to give him the best shot at getting the best results possible.

Fiona says the NHS has been brilliant for enabling Rudy to have this operation and although not expecting a miracle, they are looking forward to seeing him in less pain and having more independence.

When asked what the difference could be in Rudy's everyday life Fiona said "As a physiotherapist I realise that the SDR surgery is not going to get rid of the Cerebral Palsy but oh my

goodness, I would love for him to be able to go upstairs by himself without worrying about him falling backwards, or just to see him walk down the street holding his little brother's hand would be amazing. To many these are little things but to a child like Rudy they mean so much".

The family have thrown themselves into fundraising and got off to a flying start with Rudy's dad Rhys and his colleagues on HMS Dauntless completing a 2500 Burpee in Two Weeks Challenge, which was hard going but brought in over £1000 of donations! Rhys explained "I chose to do this challenge firstly because everyone hates burpees. With Rudy's condition he

has lots of trips and falls so no matter how mentally, physically or emotionally

There are also many exciting events planned for the near future. The family and friends of Rudy, and indeed Rudy

Other plans include a 24 hour sponsored row arranged with the local church, a music night performed by Rudy's dad and friends (aka "Southsea Lads Club") and a craft fair organised by Rudy's Grandma up in Shropshire.

Fiona approached Tree of Hope for help with their fundraising after being told about the charity by her friend, Jenny, who had also successfully fundraised for her child through us.

She says "The support we have received from Tree of Hope has been great. The ideas we get through the weekly emails have been brilliant and opened up many different fundraising avenues that we wouldn't have thought of ourselves. Also, knowing someone else is looking after Rudy's money is great and means one less thing for us to worry about."

One unexpected benefit of fundraising is that Fiona's social media skills have considerably improved - "The social media side of things has definitely tested my technical skills but I'm now very good at making videos and reels!".
